
This will be accomplished by providing caring support to communities and offering tailored individual and family wellness programs and services for First Responders, Veterans and their families.

MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT

2024 marked a year of significant growth-both programmatically and geographicallyas we continued to positively impact and save the lives of First Responders, Veterans, and their families.

Demand surged across all areas of service, including Behavioral Health, Physical Health, and the JAVELAN service dog program. Veterans and retired First Responders received life-saving training from our certified instructors, empowering them with tools to protect themselves and others.

In Behavioral Health, we introduced a groundbreaking 6-hour Sleep Recovery course. Combining meditation, yoga, and classroom instruction, the course equips First Responders with strategies to improve sleep, critical to both mental and physical health. This new offering joined our established courses in Suicide Prevention, Peer Support, Advanced Peer Support, Resiliency, and Couples Training.

We expanded proactive mental health checks with culturally competent clinicians, increasing sessions with the Omaha Police Department and launching new services with Iowa State Patrol. We continue to advocate for annual mental health screenings to be viewed as essential as physical health exams.

Our training footprint expanded into departments in West Virginia, northern Iowa, and Missouri, building on our regional presence.

To meet the growing demand for Physical Health programming, we expanded our training space, enabling more First Responders to train safely in Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu. This 100% strike-free martial art uses leverage and technique to de-escalate encounters and reduce injuries for all parties involved.

We continued to grow our specialized curriculums: Gracie Bullyproof®, which builds confidence and self-defense skills in children, and Women Empowered®, which teaches practical, scenario-based self-defense for women.

Our JAVELAN program continued to transform lives by pairing Veterans and retired First Responders with service dogs—often sourced from shelters. Graduates receive hands-on instruction to train their dogs, with all services provided at no cost. As of 2024, nearly 200 teams have completed the program, avoiding long waitlists and saving nearly \$7 million in costs compared to private providers.

To support our expanding network, we hired a Director of Chapter Services to streamline communication and growth. In 2024, we welcomed Douglas County Corrections as our sixth chapter and aim to reach twelve chapters by the end of 2025. Local chapters—led by community members and retired First Responders—raise funds to provide mental health services, lifesaving equipment, and technology to their communities.

Our mission was celebrated through major events: Guns & Hoses Hockey raised nearly \$100,000, drawing over 3,200 attendees. The 9/11 Luncheon of Honor, featuring keynote speaker Chief Todd Schmaderer, paid tribute to fallen heroes. In partnership with local businesses and Girl Scouts, we also delivered cookies and lunches to departments across the Omaha metro.

2024 was a remarkable year of impact. We look forward to serving even more in 2025.

Behavioral Health

Mental health has long carried a stigma in the first responder community, creating barriers to trust and support. We're working to change that. Through ongoing, specialized training in Suicide Prevention, Peer Support, Resiliency, and now Sleep Recovery programs, we're equipping first responders with the tools they need-delivered by culturally competent therapists who understand their unique challenges. Our mission is clear: break the stigma, build trust, and save lives.



In 2024, 200 First Responders and their families received counseling with 261 sessions held. Our trainers presented 7 Peer Support workshops with key topics covered being understanding mental health and wellness, active listening skills, crisis management, building a supportive environment, and self-care and resilience building. Additionally, we expanded our Omaha Police Department Wellness Visits to additional units to now serve 200 personnel. In 2024, we also launched our brand new Sleep Recovery for First Responders training.

Physical Health

Our Physical Health initiative advanced the training of First Responders to handle the stress and physical threats of their professions through Gracie Jiu-Jitsu® Omaha. This specialized self-defense training supports both physical and mental well-being, using weight and leverage techniques to control and deescalate situations, reducing injuries and the frequency of excessive use of force incidents.

In the past year, we achieved significant growth and impact through the expansion of all of our self-defense programs, with considerable growth in Women Empowered® and Gracie Bullyproof®. We increased training space to better serve underserved communities and first responders, with powerful success stories highlighting our trauma-informed approach—unique in Omaha — for both civilians and police. Facility renovations enhanced safety and training quality.

Internally, we strengthened staff development through instructor certifications, leadership structure, and improved tracking systems. Student enrollment continued to rise, supported by new onboarding and attendance tools. There were 6,628 check-ins to jiu-jitsu classes by 238 members. We added 6 new students to our advanced Master Cycle® classes, 5 of whom are Veterans or First Responders.

Looking ahead to 2025, we aim to surpass 250 active students, introduce structured skill progressions, expand mental health collaborations, and secure new funding streams. Operational improvements, including digital automation, will further streamline member experience and program delivery.

Spiritual Health & JAVELAN

This year we continued our local reach on our Spiritual Health Page on our website. We now have 15 participating places of worship who are prepared and equipped to support First Responders. We look forward to continuing to add to our spiritual support system in 2025.

While it is metro area concentrated at this point, we built the site with the ability to expand nationally so that we can serve all first responders. There is no preference given to any faith, rather our intention is to be inclusive for everyone.



FIRST RESPONDERS FOUNDATION JAVELAN | SERVICE DOGS FOR HEROES

Our <u>JAVELAN Service Dog Program</u> continues saving lives of Veterans and retired first responders by pairing them with a dog, many times a shelter or rescue dog.

We train these individuals to train their service dog, giving them the skills needed to train the dog for other tasks that may arise.

We provide this service at no charge to the Veteran or retired first responder. In 2024, we had 42 teams in training, with 40 being Veterans and 2 First Responders. 38 of our 42 teams were located in Nebraska and 4 in Iowa, respectively, with 9 total teams graduating their training.









